General and subject:

A very pertinent public health topic is being discussed in this article and it's nice to hear the personal aspects in this piece (own experiences living in London and visiting India). I think it is well structured and flows well for the reader.

Discussion:

Two very different cities are included in the article, and while each is well described, I think it may be nice for the reader to get a better idea of how they compare. For example, what are the pollution levels, incidence/rates of morbidity and mortality and environmental health policies compared to each other?

Referencing:

Good number and diverse references from government websites, WHO, news agencies and universities. There is some information in the article that may require referencing, especially with quoted statistics. For example, in paragraph 3, the first sentence, "Breathing in these pollutants on a daily basis has disastrous consequences on our health. 91% of the world's population live in areas where the air quality is below the standard set by WHO" should ideally be referenced.
